As such. under Provincial law, the Municipality is required to provide a simple, fast and efficient means to notify the public and residents within three kilometres of Bruce Power of any nuclear emergency.

As a patron of Inverhuron Provincial Park, the most obvious part of the alert system you will encounter are the ten public alert sirens. There are three siren sites located within the Park boundary. There is a siren located in the northeast section of the Park, one located in the south section near the "Rainbow Bridge", and one located at the western edge of the Park near the shoreline.

Testing

The alert sirens are tested daily with a "silent test" that you will not hear as a park user.

These sirens are also tested annually with a simultaneous full volume test. The full volume test may occur sometime during the park operating season. Local media will publicize the test well in advance.

During the test, you will hear a public announcement from the sirens explaining a test is in progress. You will also see a visual "strobe" light on top of the sirens and hear an "up and down wail" sound during the test. The test will last for approximately two minutes.

Emergency Actions

Please ensure your family members know the methods by which they might be notified of an emergency. A siren may sound and/or you may be notified by Police or Park officials to listen to bulletins that may be issued over local radio stations.

In the unlikely event that you hear the Public Alert Sirens during your stay at the Park, please remain calm. If you hear the sirens and/or are notified in person by Police or Park officials, go inside your vehicle and tune your radio to one of the radio stations listed in the Emergency Numbers section, located on the right of this page.

DO NOT TURN YOUR RADIO OFF until the official "all clear" has been issued.

Evacuation

Do not evacuate unless instructed to do so by radio or emergency personnel. Listen carefully to radio stations sted under Emergency Numbers for current information. If directed to evacuate, promptly follow instructions given by Police and/or Park officials. Be prepared to follow designated travel routes to leave the area.

Note

From time to time you may hear normal operating sounds from Bruce Nuclear Power Development (BNPD). These noises are not unusual & are considered routine. Hopefully they do not interfere with your visit. If you would like more information, visit the gate house or plan a tour of the nearby BNPD Visitor Centre during your stay.
